I. SCHOOL PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT

- A. - B. Meetings will be held at Parsons Elementary School at 4:30 p.m. during the month of September on a night established by the school principal.
- C. A parent, principal and supervisor committee will be formed to work on the Title I program goals.
- D. At the parent meeting, parents will be informed about the Schoolwide Program and how it works. The Title I program at PES is a schoolwide program which means that students in the entire school benefit from the different programs which have been acquired with Title I Funds.
- E. Parents will be advised of student progress through report cards, P.A.I.D. (Parents Are Informed Daily) folders, PTO meetings, and at Parent-Teacher Conferences held on **September 12th** and **February 13th** of the 2016-17 school year. State academic standards used by PES may be accessed and reviewed at www.state.tn.us/education. PES has an open door policy. After checking in with the office, parents are welcome to observe in the classroom.
- F. At the beginning of the school year, teachers will send home copies of grading policies and conference schedules. Each student will receive a student

handbook including school-related information and documents required under federal mandates.

- G. Notes or phone calls that are received are returned that day or as soon as the parent can be reached by phone, letter, or conference. Parental requests for meetings with teachers will be scheduled during teacher planning times or after school.
- H. Parent meetings, including Family Reading Night, will be announced through fliers sent home with each child to encourage attendance and on the school system website at www.decalurcountyschools.org.

III. BUILDING PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT
