#### I. SCHOOL PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT

- A. This school parental involvement plan has been developed with, agreed upon, and distributed to parents of participating children at the annual parental involvement meeting to be held in September. #### II. INVOLVEMENT OBJECTIVES

- A. An annual meeting to which all parents of participating students shall be invited and encouraged to attend will be held in the fall. At this meeting, this plan, the school-parent compact, legal requirements, and the parent's rights under NCLB will be explained. Also to be discussed at this meeting will be the school's curriculum, different methods of academic assessment used to measure student's progress and proficiency levels students are expected to meet. Results of the parental involvement surveys will also be discussed and how recommendations have been addressed.
- B. Meetings will be offered at Riverside High School at parent-teacher conference during the month of September.
- C. An advisory committee consisting of parent representatives, the school principal, the family resource director, and the Title I director will be formed to work on the Title I program goals and the School-Parent Compact.
- D. At the parent meeting, parents will be informed about the Schoolwide Program and how it works. The Title I program at RHS is a schoolwide program which means that every student within the school is eligible for services provided by Title I funding.
- E. Parents will be advised of student progress through 4 ½ week and 9 week report cards, student planners, and at Parent-Teacher Conferences held on **September 12th** and **February 13<sup>th</sup>** of the 2016-17 school year. RHS has an open door policy. After checking in with the office, parents who have made an appointment through the Principal are welcome to observe in the classroom.
- F. At the beginning of the school year, teachers will send home copies of grading policies and other relevant classroom information in a class syllabus. Each student will receive a student handbook/planner which includes school-related information and documents required under NCLB.

- G. A credit recovery/credit intervention program has been implemented to provide additional assistance to those students who are at risk for either graduation or failing courses. Parents will be notified if their child is in need of this program.
- H. Notes or phone calls that are received from parents are returned that day or as soon as the parent can be reached by phone, letter, or conference. Parental requests for meetings with teachers will be scheduled after school.
- I. Parent meetings will be announced through the local radio station, WKJQ 97.3, and through the school phone notification system, **as well as being posted on the school system website [www.decalurcountyschools.org](http://www.decalurcountyschools.org).**

### **III. BUILDING PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT**

- B. Title I shall coordinate parent involvement with Family Resource Programs when possible, by providing parenting classes, the video check-out program, and individual workshops.

- B. Provisions will be made for disabled parents as the need arises. The building is handicapped accessible with handicapped parking and wheelchair accessibility.
